### STANDING RULES – BETA ZETA CHAPTER FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Beta Zeta Chapter will pay two hundred (\$200) dollars to the President, or her appointed representative, toward expenses at the annual State Convention, which she is required to attend. A fund of four hundred (\$400) dollars is established for members of Beta Zeta registered and attending the State Convention; to be shared equally with each member's share not to exceed fifty (\$50) dollars. A fund of three hundred (\$300) dollars is established for members attending International Convention or Regional Conference; to be shared equally.
- 2. Beta Zeta Chapter shall assist members who serve on state committees and/or assignments for official state meetings or workshops with cost incurred that are not reimbursed by Alpha Delta State. The amount will be decided by the Executive Board of the Chapter and is to reflect sincere appreciation and support of the Chapter to those who are serving thusly.
- 3. A member making a meal reservation for a chapter meeting is obligated to pay the Treasurer unless cancellation is made twenty-four (24) hours before the meeting, or longer if required by the restaurant or other food service. The hostess chairman will notify both the member and the Treasurer of the amount due. Nonpayment of reservations will be added to that member's dues the following year.
- 4. The chapter will pay up to four hundred (\$400) dollars per year for speakers or outside

- entertainment at chapter meetings.
- 5. In case of loss, the person having the initiation paraphernalia will be reimbursed the amount of the deductible of their household insurance.
- 6. The chapter will pay for meals of initiates on the day of initiation.
- 7. Chapter dues of a Beta Zeta member, whose dues are paid and said member has deceased prior to State dues deadline, will be used for a memorial of the family's choice.

#### OFFICERS' AND MEMBERS' RESPONSIBILITIES

- The President will appoint Standing Committees conforming to International and Alpha Delta State recommendations. Special Chapter Committees to meet both long term and ad hoc projects will be appointed by the President as necessary.
- 2. The Treasurer will order the President's Bar Pin so that it can be presented at the time of her Installation. The Immediate Past President, or in her absence any other Past President, shall present the Pin.
- 3. An active member should attend all regularly scheduled meetings unless she presents a valid reason for absence.
- 4. If a member's dues are not paid by June 1, she will have to ask to be reinstated. The members will receive notice regarding the deadline in the following ways: newsletter, yearbook, March and April all noting the June deadline.
- 5. Members who are away from their home address for an extended period of time should notify the Corresponding Secretary in writing of their intentions concerning the meeting notices.
- 6. All members should make an effort to see that key pins of those who are no longer members of Delta Kappa Gamma are returned to the chapter so that possession of the pin indicates current membership.

Keys thus surrendered may be purchased by members who desire to replace their own keys, with the charge (half the current cost) to be added to the World Fellowship contributions.

#### COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

#### **Audit Committee**

This committee will examine all accounts and records to certify accuracy. The checklist for review, found in Guidelines for Chapter Leaders, is the minimum standard for this process.

#### **Communication Committee**

#### **Concern for Members**

The Concern for Members Committee will report concerns to the corresponding secretary and membership committee from their respective counties so that cards may be sent to a member on the occasion of illness, surgery, hospitalization, marriage, birth of a child, or other appropriate circumstances.

This Committee is also authorized to send seven (7) red roses representing the seven (7) purposes of Delta Kappa Gamma (1986) to the funeral home in case of the death of a member and three (3) red roses in a vase should be taken to a member's home in case of the death of anyone living in a member's home.

Contact the family of a deceased member to determine if the chapter may conduct a memorial service. If so, share details with the President. A single white rose may be purchased and placed in the casket.

In the event no roses are sent or no service for a member's death is conducted, a book will be purchased and placed in the library of the school where the member taught.

#### **Educational Excellence**

This committee is a combination of Program, Personal Growth and Services, Professional Affairs and Research and Legislation which was unified in 2010.

Its purpose is to discover excellence in education through recommending program ideas, developing programs to support teachers in schools and to Research programs and Legislation that impacts education.

This committee is responsible for conducting the New Teacher Project in our 4 counties and Support Early Education (SEE) by providing each with a welcome gift. They will recommend other ways to celebrate and honor teachers.

#### **Finance**

This committee will be composed of the Executive Board. They will 1) prepare the budget to be approved by the membership at the April meeting, 2) make recommendations for amounts of chapter dues and assessments, and 3) make recommendations for unexpected expenditures. The fiscal year of the Society begins July 1 and ends June 30, at which time the treasurer's records are turned over for Audit.

#### **Membership Committee**

The Membership Chairman will distribute member ship recommendation forms, followed by a presentation of the recommendation and confidential voting at a Chapter meeting. The official invitations of the Society will be extended by the President to the candidate(s).

After the chapter determines the number of new members it will accept in a given year, the Membership Chairman will announce the method of balloting.

An official Orientation Meeting with the candidate(s) for initiation will be conducted by the Membership Chairman and the President prior to the formal Initiation.

The Treasurer, sponsors of the candidate(s), and other chapter representatives may be invited to attend the Orientation. Elected candidates who are unable to attend the meeting for Initiation can be initiated at an Executive Board meeting or any other special time.

The Membership Chairman is responsible for ordering the red name badges for new members. The badges will be paid for by the chapter.

A new member no longer pays an induction fee.

#### **Music Committee**

The chairman will work with the president for suggested music for each meeting and use the resources available. In the event of a members death, the chairman will work with the president to plan music for a DKG service if one is desired.

The Delta Kappa Gamma song should be sung during each meeting. The placement of the song is up to the president.

The Happy Birthday song should be sung during each November meeting with our sister chapter Beta Eta when we are hosting each odd year.

The chairman should consider forming various musical groups from our talented members.

#### **Nominating Committee**

The Nominating Committee will be composed of 4-6 members, including the Immediate Past President.

They will present candidates for each of the offices at the March meeting in even numbered years. The chapter members will then vote on this slate of Officers at the same meeting.

In the event that an officer position becomes vacant prior to the end of a term, the President will fill the vacancy by appointment.

This committee may nominate members for state office and make recommendations for state committee members.

#### **Program Committee**

The Program Committee plans the programs for the meetings. The information is given to the Communication Committee member responsible for publishing the chapter yearbook.

A minimum of four (4) chapter meetings will follow the theme published by the International Program Committee. Founders Day Tributes, Necrology Services, and Installation of Officers are included every biennium.

In odd-numbered calendar years, the chapter will entertain Beta Eta Chapter at a luncheon in November to celebrate our mutual birthdays.

#### Scholarships, Fellowships, & Grants

The Scholarships, Fellowships, and Grants Committee should research and keep up to date information available for Scholarships, Fellowships, and Grants from International, State and Local.

They are responsible for preparing a description for each Scholarship, Fellowship, or Grant which will include contact information.



#### MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Statement of Membership: Membership in the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International shall be by invitation. Members initiated into the Society become members of chapters, state organizations, and the International Society.

Classifications of Membership: Active, Reserve, Honorary, and Collegiate

Active members shall be women who are employed in educational work at the time of their election and retired women professional educators. They shall participate in activities of the Society.

Reserve members shall be formerly active members who are retired from educational work and are unable to participate fully in the activities of the chapter because of physical disability and/or geographical location. Reserve status shall be granted by a majority vote of the chapter. Reserve members are excused from committee work. If a Reserve member is present at a chapter meeting, she is eligible to vote.

Honorary members shall be women not eligible for active membership who have rendered notable service to education. They shall be privileged to participate in all activities except that of holding office.

Collegiate members shall be undergraduate or graduate students who meet the following criteria:
Undergraduate student collegiate members shall (1) be enrolled in an institution offering an education degree and have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education, and (2) be enrolled within the last two years of their undergraduate education. Graduate student

collegiate members shall have the intent to continue academically and professionally in the field of education.

When a collegiate member starts her career as a paid educator, she will pay active member dues and become an active member. If a collegiate member does not pursue a career as an educator, her membership will expire upon graduation or withdrawal from the education degree program.
